Introduction...

Prime Minister Modi soon after his party came to power announced his vision to set up 100 smart cities followed by budgetary allocation of Rs. 7060 Crores for 2014-15. Since then a race has been on among cities to land on the smart cities list that the ministry of urban development is compiling.

The Cabinet in April 2015 cleared Prime Minister Narendra Modi's favoured 100 smart cities project in a bid to recast the urban centres of the country to make them more livable and inclusive besides driving economic growth. The Cabinet also approved central government spending of about rupees one lakh crore over the next five years on urban development under two new urban missions. While the Smart Cities Mission will get an outlay of Rs 48,000 crore, the AMRUT mission will receive Rs 50,000 crore over the next five years. In comparison, the central outlay for nine years of the JNNURM mission was Rs 42,900 crore. It also cleared the Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation (AMRUT) for 500 cities. Under the Smart Cities Mission, each selected city would get central assistance of Rs 100 crore per year for five years. Cost of implementing Smart City projects would be funded through meaningful PPPs and International participation.

Each Smart City aspirant will be selected through a 'City Challenge Competition' intended to link financing with the ability of the cities to perform to achieve the mission objectives. Each state will shortlist a certain number of smart city aspirants as per the norms to be indicated and they will prepare smart city proposals for further evaluation for extending central support. Kanpur, Allahabad, Lucknow, Jhansi, Faizabad and Varanasi in Uttar Pradesh are among the 100 cities proposed by Government of India.

Objectives and Format of Convention...

The objective of LMA Convention 2015 is to attract focus on this theme and deliberate on how to develop Smart Cities supported possibly by Smart Villages for faster growth for the State. Deliberations in the convention will be through presentations by distinguished panels of domain experts. Emphasis will be on out of the box ideas, successful case studies and action orientation. While the deliberations will be generic, the focus will be on policy prescriptions and agenda for Uttar Pradesh.


